



## Information from Östgöta Nation regarding Covid-19

Dear Östgötar,

On the 27th of October 2020, the Swedish Public Health Agency, in consultation with, among others, the infection-control doctor in Region Skåne, decided on stricter general advice in Skåne, at least three weeks from now. With this in mind, Östgöta Nation has decided to reduce its opening-hours for pubs and sittings, as well as to once again reduce the number of guests allowed on our premises. The Quratel therefore wishes to remind all members of the extensive spread of Covid-19 that is currently affecting Skåne, and of the importance of following the authorities' advice and recommendations.

The Quratel also wants to remind all our members of the rules that apply when present at any of our various activities. Östgöta Nation reserves the right to reject guests from the nation who do not follow the rules below.

- All serving takes place at the tables. You will not be served at the bar.
- All food and drink must be consumed while sitting down at the tables.
- One must not mingle between the tables on the premises or outdoors. This means that one must remain seated at the table one's party has been assigned throughout one's stay.
- Chairs or tables may not be moved without the staff's approval.
- One must keep at least 1.5m distance to all guests who do not belong to the party seated at the same table - ie. larger groups that are distributed between different tables must not mingle in between themselves across tables. Distance-keeping also applies to the areas between tables, the queue for the toilets and the entrances and exits.
- If you are ill or have shown symptoms within the last 48 hours, you must stay at home.
- Dancing is not allowed under any circumstances.

We hope that everyone takes care of each other, by showing respect to the existing rules of conduct and to their fellow human beings, so that we may continue to visit and thrive in the nation in a safe way. For questions, contact [q@ostgota.nu](mailto:q@ostgota.nu).
